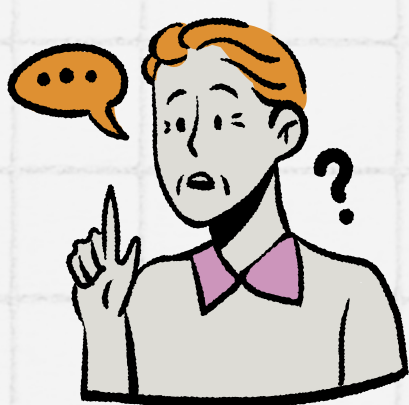


adverbs

Adverbs are words that we use to modify or intensify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. They want to show mood, time, place and quantity.

An adverb can give information about time, place, manner, or number in which an action occurs.

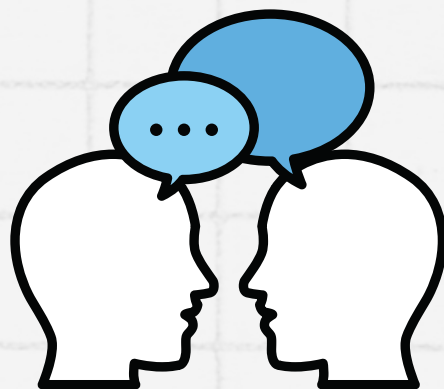
Adverbs do not change according to number or gender. This is because adverbs modify verbs, adjectives and adverbs, not nouns.



Hola!

- An adverb usually comes after the verb it modifies.
- An adverb always comes before the adjective it modifies.
- An adverb always comes before the adverb it modifies

We use them to express where, when, how, how long, and how often an action takes place.



Adverbs give extra details about what's taking place, and they actually have the power to completely change the meaning of sentences.
