

SUBJECT PRONOUNS

Subject pronouns are words that replace the subject, name or noun of the sentence and are used to replace people, animals or things, without having to name them over and over.

They replace the person, place, or thing that is either doing something or being something and verbs must be conjugated to match.

So, when you use a subject pronoun, you need to be sure that the subject pronoun and the verb agree with each other.
